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Fast-Track Preparatory Programs

The fast-track preparatory programs at CamTech University are non-degree programs that are designed to help learners prepare for academic studies or employment. We offer three programs, including the General English Program (GEP), the English for Academic Purposes (EAP), and the Pre-University Program (PUP). The GEP is a comprehensive language learning program that focuses on improving the four key language skills. The EAP is designed to help non-native speakers of English improve their academic language skills, while the PUP is a preparatory program that helps high school graduates to meet the academic requirements for direct entry into their desired university programs. Each program has different levels and hours, and learners can choose the program that suits their needs.

1. General English Program (GEP)

The General English Program (GEP) is a comprehensive language learning program specifically designed for general English learners. It is tailored to help learners make rapid progress in English on the four key language skills, including reading, writing, listening, and speaking. The program contains six levels to allow students to progress from basic communication skills to advanced fluency. Learners will engage in a variety of learning activities, including classroom instruction, homework assignments, independent study, and practice exercises. Each level lasts within 90 hours per term per term. At the end of each level, students will be assessed to determine their progress and readiness to move on to the next level.

2. English for Academic Purposes (EAP)

The English for Academic Purposes is designed to help non-native speakers of English improve their academic language skills and prepare them for an academic study that uses English as a medium of instruction. It helps learners develop the language skills necessary to succeed academically. The study of this program focuses on four key areas, including writing, reading, speaking, and listening, as well as grammar and vocabulary. There are six levels (A1 to C2). Learners are required to complete level C1 to be eligible to enroll in the bachelor's degree program. Each level lasts within 90 hours per term.

No.	Level	Test Score	Description
1	A1: Beginner	- 49	Learners have a limited or no understanding of English. They can use English for basic greetings, introduce themselves, and understand simple instructions or phrases related to daily life. The course primarily focuses on basic vocabulary and grammar usage and simple communication.
2	A2: Elementary	50-59	Learners can comprehend and express themselves in familiar situations. They can participate in basic conversations regarding personal information, daily routines, shopping, and describe their immediate environment. The course focuses on the expansion of vocabulary and sentence structures to become more varied.
3	B1: Intermediate	60-69	Learners gain greater fluency and independence in expressing their ideas. They can engage in conversations on various topics, give opinions, and explain their views. There is an increased ability to understand longer texts and follow discussions. The course focuses on improving grammar and vocabulary usage to become more accurate and fluent.
4	B2: Upper Intermediate	70-79	Learners can communicate effectively in both familiar and unfamiliar contexts. They can express themselves clearly and spontaneously, engage in debates, and present arguments. The course focuses on improving reading and listening skills to improve learners' capacity to use idiomatic expressions and demonstrate a solid grasp of grammar.
5	C1: Advanced	80-89	Learners can understand complex texts and abstract ideas. They can participate in academic or professional discussions, make persuasive arguments, and deliver presentations. The course focuses on expanding vocabulary and improving the use of grammatical accuracy, idioms, and collocations.
6	C2: Proficient	90-100	This level indicates near-native or native-like fluency. Learners can effortlessly understand nearly all spoken and written language types, including complex academic or specialized texts. They can express themselves spontaneously, using precise vocabulary and idiomatic expressions. Their language skills are comparable to those of educated native speakers.

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3. Pre-University Program (PUP)

The Pre-University Program is a preparatory program designed to help high school graduates and current 12th graders who may not meet the academic requirements for direct entry into their desired university programs. The program includes four courses: English for Academic Purposes, Fundamental Mathematics, Academic Study Skills, and Computer Fundamentals. By completing these courses, students will be better equipped to succeed in their university studies and beyond. Students are not required to take all courses, but only those that are relevant to their chosen degree program.

Brief description of each course:

- 1. **English for Academic Purposes:** This course is designed to improve students' English language skills specifically for academic purposes. - 4. **Computer Fundamentals:** This course introduces computer applications that are commonly used in university-level courses such as Microsoft Office Suite (Word, Excel, PowerPoint), email communication, internet browsing, and research skills. The course is suitable for students who want to develop computer skills that are necessary for university studies or for those who need to meet the computer proficiency requirements for their desired degree program.
